National Code 2007
Information for new and continuing students studying at Holmesglen

All international students must make themselves aware of the recent changes to ESOS Act and the National Code 2007, which became effective 1 July 2007.

Due to these changes, international students need to carefully consider their enrolment/ re-enrolment for each study period as some of the rules that previously applied will no longer be valid.

As an international student studying at Holmesglen, please ensure you comply with the following National Code 2007 changes when varying your enrolment in all future study periods;

- It is your responsibility to complete your course within the expected duration as stated in your eCOE. To do this, you will be required to enrol in full time studies and repeat any module/subjects previously failed. A reduced enrolment load may be allowed only in limited compelling and compassionate circumstances or as a result of an intervention strategy which you and Holmesglen Institute have agreed upon.
- If you have applied for and been approved for Credit Transfer or Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL), you must be able to complete your course within the expected duration of your eCOE or earlier if possible.

You need to be aware that extensions to your eCOE may not be granted unless you can evidence compelling and compassionate circumstances or have been approved a documented intervention strategy that has been implemented.

One of your student visa conditions is maintaining satisfactory course progress. Holmesglen Institute implements the DEST-DIAC Course Progress Policy and Procedures. Under the DEST-DIAC Course Progress Policy, a student has made unsatisfactory progress if the student has not successfully completed or demonstrated competency in at least 50% of the course requirements in a study period. A study period at Holmesglen Institute is considered a semester of not more than six months in duration.

Holmesglen Institute's International Centre Course Progress Review aims to identify any reasons for your inability to satisfy the course progress requirements and to put in place any intervention strategies.

Under the National Code 2007, students undertaking ELICOS programs are required to maintain 80% attendance.
